EU-Japan free trade

The EU-Japan free trade agreement may help to significantly boost pork exports to Japan.



Pork exports from Denmark to Japan began in the mid-1970s and really took off in the 1980s. Until now, a complex Japanese customs system has prevented Danish Crown from expanding its collaboration with its Japanese customers.

- The free trade agreement creates better opportunities for exporting high-quality specialty products to Japan. Danish Crown already has a foothold in this Japanese market which is supplied from our abattoir in Ringsted, Denmark. Now our task is to increase sales and strengthen customer relationships, and fortunately the Japanese market has already indicated its interest in doing so, says Jais Valeur.

The Japanese market already accounts for a considerable share of Danish Crown's streaky bacon and brisket sales. Last year Danish Crown exported more than 100,000 tonnes of pork to Japan.

Danish Crown paid more than half a billion kroner extra for the pigs

In the first six months of the financial year 2016/2017 Danish Crown increased the payment for pigs supplied by the farmer owners by almost 15% or DKK 600 million relative to the year before

- It's very positive to be able to pay our owners a fair price for their pigs. We have seen a strong demand for Danish pork in Asia alongside a decline in the production of pigs in northern Europe. These facts have been the key to increase the market price for fresh pork, says Danish Crown Group CEO Jais Valeur.

The raising pork prices, stable prices for beef and several minor acquisitions have lifted the Group's revenue over the period by DKK 1,3 billion, seeing it surpassing DKK 30 billion for the first time in the Danish Crown history.

A good demand and a strong sales effort has ensured solid earnings from the fresh meat business, while the earnings in the groups processing companies have been hit by the rapid increase in the prices for raw materials. By keeping the costs down, Danish Crown has managed to secure an operating profit of DKK 1,026 million.

The net profit for the period was DKK 812 million, which is on a par with the year before, and deemed to be acceptable.

- This is not bad results at all. I am pleased with the significant improvement in the payments to our owners. Never the less I must admit the operating profit in our processing companies haven't met our expectations. This is mainly due to a certain delay. When the pork price rises rapidly we need to increase the prices paid by the retailers and unfortunately it takes some months, explains Jais Valeur.

DAT-Schaub, a globally market-leading supplier of natural casings for sausage production, successfully increased its earnings considerably. The prices of as well sheep and hog casings are rising, which makes the outlook for the rest of the year look promising.

In the past six months, Danish Crown has launched its strategy towards 2021, where the objective is to develop the business in the four main markets in northern Europe as well as in Asia. In addition, there will be a global focus on four selected categories.

- We have got off to a good start in our efforts to implement the strategy. We have sold our US subsidiary with a profit of more than DKK 0.5 billion, which will be included in the financial statement of the year, and we have acquired three smaller companies. In my opinion we have defined the direction for the future of Danish Crown, but there is still a lot of work to be done if we are to deliver on the ambitious commitment we have given our owners, says Jais Valeur.


The target during the strategy period is to increase the settlement price paid to the cooperative members by DKK 0.60 relative to an index showing the price of pork in other four EU countries with significant pork exports.

Danish Crown launches ambitious growth package

Danish Crown has launched a growth package to encourage farmers to invest in producing more pigs and thereby ensure more pigs for the Danish abattoirs




Danish Crown has for the last several years had to deal with the fact that the number of pigs for the Danish abattoirs has continuously decreased. It has meant closing of abattoirs even though the demand for Danish pork is unabated on the key export markets. To reduce the risk of having to close yet another abattoir Danish Crown has decided to launch a growth package to ensure more pigs for the Danish abattoirs.

The growth package means that Danish Crown is now offering its existing members a cash growth supplement of DKK 0.50 per kg of additional pork supplied. At the same time, a financial contribution is being offered to new cooperative members, concurrently with the possibility of supplying more welfare pigs to the UK market. The initiative is designed to reverse the increasing decline in the supply of pigs to Danish abattoirs.

The new growth supplement is being supplemented with an expansion of a subsidy scheme for new producers of weaners for the UK market. At the same time, Danish Crown is ready to pay a financial contribution of DKK 0.30 per kg to new suppliers of slaughter pigs, who are also offered free advisory services.

- As I see it, this growth package is a win-win for everyone. Existing cooperative members are able to expand their production, and specialist producers of weaners can lease new housing units and start producing slaughter pigs. Finally, we are welcoming new cooperative members to Danish Crown with a cash contribution, and I actually have high hopes for these initiatives, says Erik Bredholt, Chairman of Danish Crown.

Danish Crown has recently presented a growth package with the clear aim of securing more slaughter pigs for the group's Danish slaughterhouses. Employees will start noticing the effects of the package from 1 September, when members of Bonusgrisen start supplying Danish Crown.


- Our members really like Danish Crown as a company. Basically, they prefer to supply their animals to a Danish cooperative, where the ownership structure makes it possible to have a say in the decision-making. At the same time, I will make no secret of the fact that Danish Crown's new strategy has strengthened the belief in the company among our members, says Morten Biel Hansen, who is a member of the Board of Directors in Bonusgrisen and CEO of the sister company B2B Bonus.

Bonusgrisen was founded in 2007 with the aim of ensuring that members get the best possible price for their breeding animals, weaners, sows and slaughter pigs. Bonusgrisen handles about 2 million pigs a year, of which approx. half are exported as weaners. The members that supply slaughter pigs will now each become cooperative members of Danish Crown, while at the same time remaining members of Bonusgrisen.

As new Danish Crown suppliers, Bonusgrisen's members will be offered one year of free advice, and at the same time be entitled to a financial contribution of DKK 0.30 per kg.

- In continuation of our work with the 4WD strategy, Danish Crown's Board of Directors appointed a committee which was tasked with coming up with suggestions on how to best increase the supply of slaughter pigs. One of the results is a growth package where among other a financial contribution is offered to new cooperative members. All Danish Crowns owners and 8,000 employees in Denmark benefit from that, says Søren F. Eriksen, CEO in Danish Crown Pork.

Expectations are that the members of Bonusgrisen will supply Danish Crown with about 600,000 slaughter pigs in the first year alone.



Information about the strike in Denmark

Due to a discontent in the development of the collective bargaining handled by the Trade Union NNF and the Confederation of Danish Industry (DI), our employees at the slaughterhouses went on a strike from Thursday April 20th in the evening. All employees were back at work on Tuesday April 25th.

DI handles collective bargaining on behalf of the employers but Danish Crown is involved in the negotiations where a joint collective agreement on behalf of 500,000 Danish employees is negotiated.

We are deeply sorry for any inconvenience this may have caused for our customers and we are doing everything we can to fulfil our commitments to our customers as fast as possible.



Danish Crown sells Plumrose USA

Danish Crown has signed an agreement to sell its American subsidiary Plumrose USA to Brazilian-based JBS, which is the world's largest meat-processing company. The sale is based on the 4WD strategy, under which Danish Crown has decided to focus its business on Northern Europe and Asia.



- The focus of Danish Crown's 4WD strategy is to lead our home markets in Northern Europe, to further grow our positions in Asia and to expand our leading position in casings globally. We have therefore decided to sell Plumrose USA. I am certain that JBS, with its wide presence and access to raw materials in North America, is a perfect match for Plumrose USA and will help fortify its business for the benefit of many loyal customers. Plumrose USA is an excellent company, which has made significant progress in recent years, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Plumrose USA management and employees for their committed efforts, says Group CEO Jais Valeur, Danish Crown.

Four months ago, Danish Crown launched its ambitious 4WD strategy with the predominant aim of growing its four home markets in Denmark, Sweden, Poland and the UK. The strategy includes plans to expand exports to Asia in general, and to establish a production facility in China based on Danish pork. Also, Danish Crown is focused on achieving global leadership in selected categories.

- Selling Plumrose USA is a step forward in achieving the long-term goals of the 4WD strategy. We have strengthened our financial capacity quite substantially. This gives us extensive room for manoeuvre and for taking part in what I would call a necessary consolidation of the food sector in our four home markets, says Jais Valeur. The sale of Plumrose USA to JBS is contingent on approval by the US competition authorities.
